

Safe and Affordable Chapter Housing



The Auburn FarmHouse Association is raising funds to build a new chapter house, with a goal of \$2 million.



Construction on the \$3.4 million renovation project of the chapter house was complete and members moved into the house in August 2016.



Goal to raise \$4.5 million for new chapter house. To date, \$4.3 million has been raised. The new chapter house was dedicated on Sept. 28, 2018.



Grants were made to the Oklahoma State FH Associaton to maintain and operate the educational portion of the chapter house. They are in a campaign to reduce their mortgage debt.



Over half of their \$600,000 fundraising goal has been raised. Construction and renovation work was completed in Fall 2018.



The Kansas State FH Association is raising money for a \$2.5 million expansion and renovation project.



Grants were made to the North Carolina State FH Associaton to maintain and operate the educational portion of the chapter house.



The \$6 million chapter house was completed in 2016.



Renovations and health and safety upgrades were completed in 2018. The Association received a \$450,000 chapter housing loan from the FarmHouse Foundation.



Grants were made to the Michigan State FH Associaton to maintain and operate the educational portion of the chapter house. \$3,046,955 GRANTED FOR 9 HOUSING PROJECTS


